


#### Course Prerequisites

The course *Academic Writing for Research* is for students working towards their PhD degree.

#### Course Language

English



#### Method of Instruction

The course is taught through practical tasks and lectures; both presuppose students' active participation (individually, in small groups, and in class discussions)

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

The course features such professionally oriented issues as finding one's academic community, writing a research article, English abstract to the PhD dissertation, contribution to a conference proceeding as well as language-specific issues of mastering topic-specific lexis and grammar. The course provides for further development of productive, receptive, and interactional skills.



#### COURSE AIM

Building upon the courses of Academic Writing at the Bachelor and Master levels, the course of Academic Writing for Research aims to familiarize students with the main written products of conducting PhD research and the context and process of making them.

The objectives of the course are to teach students how to:

- find their scientific community and observe its legal and ethical norms,
- write a research article and respective parts of their dissertation in English;
- write a conference proceeding and prepare a PowerPoint presentation to it.

#### **COVERED MAIN TOPICS**

#### **MODULE 1. Academic Communication, Publishing, and Integrity**

Focus on: writing shorter and longer Academic Bios; reading Editorial information, Information about how to submit, Guidelines for Contributors;

filling in Copyright agreement, Conflict of Interest Statement / Declaration

#### **MODULE 2. Structure and Language of a Research Article**

Focus on: key criteria for a good title; useful phrases to begin an article and link paragraphs

#### **MODULE 3.** The Introduction Section of a Research Article

Focus on: stating the field, subfield and issues;

writing the literature review;

formulating the research problem, (research question / hypothesis),

purpose;

making the statement of value;

describing the article structure outline

#### **COVERED MAIN TOPICS**

#### **MODULE 4. Methods, Results and Conclusions**

Focus on: using relevant tenses and modal verbs; hedging; vocabulary and structures to comment visuals; writing an Abstract and Keywords


#### **MODULE 5. PhD Dissertation**

Focus on: PhD dissertation matrix and referencing styles; writing and English Abstract in the PhD dissertation

Focus on: writing the Statement of Purpose in the research proposal for academic mobility;

writing a conference proposal; creating a PPT for a scientific conference
