

Loca'LITY. n. f. [from local.] Existence in place; relation of place, or distance.

That the foul and angels are devoid of quantity and dimenfion, and that they have nothing to do with groffer locality, is generally opinioned. Glanville's Scep.

Loca'LLY, adj. [from local.] With respect to place.

Whether things, in their natures fo divers as body and fpirit, which almost in nothing communicate, are not effentially divided, though not locally diffant, I leave to the rea-Glanville's Scep.

Loca'tion. n. f. [locatio, Latin.] Situation with respect to

place; act of placing; state of being placed.

LOCH. n. f. A lake. Scottish.
