

I. We use **by** ... to say how somebody travels:
by car / by train / by plane / by boat / by ship / by bus / by bike / by underground etc.

by road / by rail / by air / by sea

Jess usually goes to work by bus.

II. You cannot use **by** if you say **my car / the train / a taxi** etc. We say:
by car *but in my car* (*not by my car*)
by train *but on the train* (*not by the train*)

III. a) We use **in** for **cars** and **taxis**:

They didn't come in their car. They came in a taxi.

b) We use **on** for **bikes, motorbikes** and **public transport** (buses, trains etc.):
We travelled on the 6.45 train.

NB! in/on a boat

IV. We say **on foot**:

Did you come here by car or on foot?

Put in **by**, **in** or **on**.
